



Avis *eToll* Electronic Toll Collection Fact Sheet

Summary

Offering innovative, time-saving amenities to car rental customers has long been part of the Avis "We Try Harder" approach to service. With electronic toll collection (*eToll*) solutions from Avis, renters can eliminate the need to carry change or wait in long cash payment lines at toll booths and simply zip through electronic toll payment lanes.

History

- In 2006, Avis becomes the first car rental company to offer electronic toll collection, by introducing *eToll* on the E-ZPassSM network. The service is available in the Northeast United States, from Maine to Virginia. Vehicles are equipped with transponders.
- Avis launches *eToll* in the metropolitan Houston area (in 2006) and in Florida and Colorado (in 2007). The service utilizes video tolling (e.g. PlatePass[®]) and does not require a vehicle transponder.
- In 2007, Avis debuts *eToll* on the I-Pass network, in the Chicago metropolitan area. Vehicles are equipped with transponders.
- In September 2007, Avis brings *eToll* availability to Puerto Rico with AutoExpreso service. Vehicles are equipped with transponders.

Use

- *eToll* is available for \$2.50 per day for the length of the rental (with a maximum charge of \$10.00 per week), plus toll charges.
- Toll charges and daily fees for the service are additional and processed as a separate charge to the credit or debit card presented at the time of rental.
- *eToll* is administered by Highway Toll Administration, LLC (HTA).
